Beech Avenue Proposed Development

In January 2018. Beech Avenue LLC informed MCA that it proposes to construct nineteen single-family, detached houses on a vacant 5-acre parcel of land that it has purchased on Beech Avenue between Page Ave and Linden Ave. A "Community Meeting" required by the Montgomery County Planning Board was planned for January 16th at the Davis Library. At the January MCA meeting, MCA president, Allen Myers, and other residents who attended this meeting will provide a report on that meeting.

The Planning Board requires a "Community Meeting" to be held in advance of a developer's submission of a formal site plan for a property. It is an opportunity for the developer to explain its project to neighbors and allows for an informal exchange of ideas and concerns about the project between the developer and the neighbors. While anyone is invited to attend the "Community Meeting", only those residents within a one half mile radius of the property actually receive a mailed notice about the meeting. The developer may still present its plan to the entire neighborhood at an MCA meeting and MCA and individual residents have an opportunity to testify before the Planning Board on the proposed development.

FAES PROPOSES SEVEN NEW HOMES ON VACANT LAND

At Cypress Ave and Acacia Ave

A "Community Meeting" was held on October 16, 2017 by the Foundation for the Advancement of Education in the Sciences (FAES) on its new development plans for its vacant property at the corner of Cypress Ave and Acacia Ave.

As background, several years ago FAES had proposed to build townhouses on this vacant land and the land which is currently occupied by 4 FAES homes (3 homes on Cypress Ave and one home at the corner of Cypress Ave and W. Cedar Lane). Driving development of the FAES land was and is an FAES hope to provide affordable housing for NIH post doc fellows at the National Institutes of Health (NIH) whose work involves critical research on important health issues such as AIDS, etc. Maplewood was against this townhouse proposal for what was, in essence, a high density dormitory style development incompatible with the surrounding single family homes. FAES is now proposing to build seven single family detached homes only on the vacant land at the corner of Cypress Ave and Acacia Ave. Each of the homes is expected to house up to five NIH fellows.

Maplewood residents at the October 16th meeting expressed concern about anticipated parking and traffic generated by the new homes. FAES indicated that, based on experience with the existing four FAES homes, not all NIH post doc fellows have cars and/or need to drive to work. FAES duly noted the concern, however. With funding for construction yet to be lined up, FAES noted that the homes will likely be constructed one at a time rather than all at once. FAES has indicated its willingness to present its plans at a future MCA meeting as the plans become clearer.

New Bethesda Police 2nd District Commander to Speak At MCA Meeting

Captain Paul J. Liquorie has recently replaced Captain Dave Falcinelli as the Bethesda Police 2nd District Commander. In addition to providing information about the overall crime situation in Bethesda, Captain Liquorie will address issues specific to Maplewood including enforcement of violations of the rush hour turn restrictions at Linden and Beech Avenues as well as the results of a police investigation of a house fire on Danbury Road that occurred in September 2017 and which involved loss of life.

Danbury Road House Fire

MCA has learned that the Montgomery County Office of Permitting Services has ordered the owner to raze the house at 5212 Danbury Rd. where a fire and loss of life occurred in September 2017. The owner has appealed the order. A hearing on his appeal will be held at 9:30 am at the County Board of Appeals in the County Council Office Building in Rockville on Wednesday, February 28, 2018. Immediate neighbors and others in the vicinity of the house have requested that MCA become a "party of record" at the proceeding.

New French International Elementary School

In September 2017, MCA president, Allen Myers, was contacted by legal counsel for the French International School (FIS) who informed him of new plans for the FIS elementary school. FIS indicated that it was dropping its proposal to construct a new elementary school along Old Georgetown Rd south of Beech Ave (in the Wyngate neighborhood) and that its proposal to purchase the property currently owned by the Federation of Societies in Experimental Biology (FASEB) on Rockville Pike just south of Pooks Hill Rd had been accepted. FIS is still formulating these plans and anticipates presenting them at the March MCA meeting. Some preliminary information will be provided at the January MCA meeting.
