From *The Mapleleaf* Archives of 1955:

MAPLEWOOD CITIZENS" ASSOCIATION

For new residents of Maplewood it may be well to consider what the Maplewood Citizens' Association is, and what it has accomplished.

Our Association was born in 1949, as result of the necessity for protecting our property from the encroachment of apartments. Since that time there have been eleven specific instances in which our Association has participated in defeating proposals which would have permitted apartments in or near Maplewood. Four times the property known as the Parker Tract at Wisconsin Avenue and Cedar Lane has been the subject of rezoning (five times if you count the recent petition for reconsideration). Because of our type of presentation, the full support of all the people in Maplewood, and the cooperation of our neighboring Associations, we have been successful, - but the fight is not yet over, we fear.

The Association meets only four times a year, - the third Wednesday in September, November and March, and the first Wednesday in May. The annual dues are \$1.00 per household.

Through the efforts of the Association 90 pink dogwood trees have been planted to further beautify our landscape. A large portion of the ground was treated with spore powder to kill beetles. We have participated in the Civil Defense Program of the Countv. On occasion we have queried candidates for the County Council on subjects which were of peculiar interest to our neighborhood.

The black-top walk from the end of Kingsley Avenue to the Alta Vista School was installed due to the efforts of our Association.

We have been active in endeavoring to get a recreation center for this area, - a project we hope to see completed shortly.

Busses were prevented from running on Locust Avenue and thereby creating a traffic hazard.

Poor electric power service (long power failures) has been brought vigorously to the attention of the company, and at least partially corrected.

On Christmas Eve we meet to sing carols throughout the neighborhood, a custom which has grown in popularity with the passing years.

Through our membership in the Montgomery Civic Federation and our delegates thereto, we keep informed on the latest developments in the County.

What do we ask of the new residents, as well as the old, in Maplewood? (1) an intelligent and abiding interest in your community; (2) active participation in the affairs of the Association and other civic organizations; (3) attendance at our meetings, where you may get to know and enjoy the fellowship of your neighbors.

Emergency Preparedness for Your Home

The guest speaker at the January 20th Maplewood Citizens Association meeting will be Mr. Joe Corona, Outreach Coordinator for the Montgomery County Office of Emergency Management and Homeland Security. This office plans, prevents, prepares and protects against major threats that may harm, disrupt or destroy our communities, commerce and institutions. Its mission is to effectively manage and coordinate the County's unified

response, mitigation, and recovery from the consequences of such disasters or events should they occur. It also serves as a resource to County residents on emergency preparedness for all hazards.

Mr. Corona will discuss the role of his office during an emergency and steps that you can take to ensure your family is better prepared should a disaster occur.
