NEW FRENCH INTERNATIONAL SCHOOL PLANS

Just as this issue of *The Mapleleaf* was going to press, MCA president, Allen Myers, was informed by the French International School (FIS)/Lycee Rochambeau legal counsel that FIS has abandoned its plans to construct and operate a new elementary school on Old Georgetown Road just south of Beech Dr. The elementary school is presently located in the Rollingwood neighborhood Chevy Chase, MD.

The FIS bid for the property of the Federation of American Societies For Experimental Biology

(FASEB) at <u>9650 Rockville Pike</u>, which is along Rt. 355 just south of Pooks Hill Rd. and adjacent to homes on Alta Vista Rd and Alta Vista Terrace, has been accepted. MCA had not been informed that the FASEB property had even been for sale.

There will be a lengthy process to convert the current Conditional Use of the property from FASEB to FIS. At this time, MCA expects the FIS to present its plans for the new school to the Maplewood community at the January 2018 MCA meeting.

"FOOD FOR THOUGHT"

According to ampleharvest.org: "While more than 50 million Americans live in food insecure homes (including a quarter of all children under the age of six), more than 42 million Americans grow fruit, vegetables herbs and nuts in home gardens – often more than they can use, preserve or give to friends. The rest adds up to more than <u>11 billion pounds</u> of wasted food – enough to feed 28 million hungry Americans."

FOOD WASTE: have you thought about how much YOU contribute to this unfortunate reality? Several years ago Maplewood residents were offered an opportunity to recycle their food waste by paying a minimal monthly fee to the Compost Crew (<u>www.compostcrew.com</u>) for a weekly pickup of food waste. No doubt you have seen their green and white buckets curbside on Fridays. The Compost Crew was started in 2011 by two local young entrepreneurs (graduates of Walt Whitman High School). The business has now grown to the point where they actually produce their own compost product. What a great way to "give back" to the planet. **Check out their story at http://compostcrew.com/story/**.

Please remember it is a Montgomery County law that dogs be on leashes at all times except at County dog parks and please pick up your dog's poop –it is the neighborly thing to do!

Visible and large residence house numbers are critical in emergencies.

Please insure that storm drains and roads in your vicinity are clear of vines, overgrowth, tree limbs etc. to avoid street flooding in rain events; street signs should always be visible. Other drivers and pedestrians will thank you for keeping intersections free from overgrowth that limits the visibility of drivers.

Our guest speaker for the September 27th MCA general meeting will be Mr. Joe Corona, Community Outreach Coordinator for the Montgomery County Office of Emergency Management and Homeland Security. The recent hurricanes in Texas and

Florida clearly demonstrate the importance for emergency preparedness. And those of us who have lived here a while know the Washington area is subject to extreme weather conditions and is a potential terrorist target. While federal, state, and local governments have plans for emergencies, there is also a need for individual families to have their own plans and to make preparations for natural disasters and other emergencies. Mr. Corona will discuss some of the major hazards that Montgomery County faces and some specific steps you can take to prepare for them along with information on how to write a plan and build a kit that will help you and your family prepare for an emergency.
